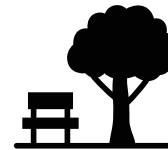

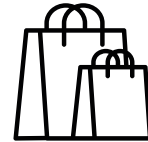

WILLIAM ARNOLD FAMILY LOG HOME

224 S. Main Street | Williamstown, KY



Built in the early 19th century, the William Arnold Family Log Home is believed to be home of descendants of William Arnold, founder of Williamstown. Arnold was Grant County's first sheriff.

Williamstown became the county seat when Arnold offered to donate 2 ½ acres for public buildings. The William Arnold Family Log Home sits on Main Street and greets visitors to Williamstown, as they are traveling north on US 25 and entering the downtown area.

The two-story house is constructed of huge poplar logs with a wood shingle roof characteristic of the log houses built during Kentucky's early days. Maintained and cared for by the Grant County Historical Society, the building contains pioneer era furniture, memorabilia, early photographs, and artifacts of early Grant County.

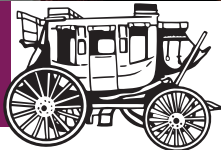
It was most likely operated as a tavern for overnight guests, as well as a residence for Arnold's daughter. The log home originally sat on High Street, but was later moved to behind the Williamstown Baptist Church before being moved to its permanent home on Main Street on land donated to the city. The city of Williamstown, the Grant County Historical Society and the Grant County Tourism and Convention Commission formed a partnership to operate the log home as a visitor's center and it is staffed with knowledgeable historians from Memorial Day through November and free tours are available.





SHERMAN TAVERN

3985 Dixie Highway | Dry Ridge, KY



Historical Sites

Located on Dixie Highway in front of Sherman Elementary School, Sherman Tavern has lovingly been restored by a group of dedicated volunteers called Friends of Sherman Tavern. The wooden, frame home contains many artifacts that were found on the property. In its heyday, the tavern was a half-way point between Cincinnati and Lexington for stock drovers to stop and spend the night. The tavern also was a stagecoach stop.



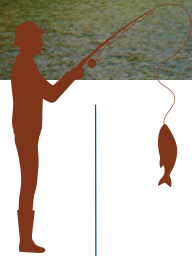
The building contains several stone fireplaces built from Kentucky limestone. A farming museum and a brick outhouse are also on the property. The tavern was built in 1812 by Louis Myers, a Revolutionary War soldier who was given a land grant for his service from the state of Virginia. With the advent of the railroad, livestock was shipped by rail rather than driven and travelers could get to their destinations quicker by rail than stagecoach, so the tavern became a residence until the Friends of Sherman Tavern began a mission to save and restore the property.

It now contains many items from Grant County's history and is also open for free tours by local historians from Memorial Day through November in a partnership formed between the Friends of Sherman Tavern and Grant County Tourism.

The Ark Encounter

If you are looking for an adventure of epic proportions, then you've come to the right place as Williamstown, the county seat of Grant County, Kentucky is home to the Ark Encounter, a life-size replica of Noah's Ark from the Bible.

The attraction is operated by Answers In Genesis (AiG) and since its opening in July 2016, millions of visitors from all across the United States and all corners of the globe have traveled here to view what is believed to be the largest timber frame structure in the world.

Ark Facts

- 510 feet long
- 51 feet high
- 85 feet wide

But the Ark itself was just the beginning, there have been major expansions including the addition of a 2,500-seat auditorium featuring a 70-foot-long LED screen on the stage. Well-known musicians and Bible conferences are held frequently.



The Ark contains three decks. Deck 1 gives visitors a glimpse at the size and scope of the Ark as visitors walk through food and supply storage areas and learn about animal kinds found on the Ark. Deck 2 focuses on the pre-world flood, animals and an explanation of how God could have prepared Noah for building the Ark. Deck 3 features the possible living quarters of Noah and his family, geology of the flood, post-flood events and a special museum of the Bible exhibit. The grounds of the Ark include Ararat Ridge Zoo featuring a kangaroo walkabout and daily animal shows, which are included with Ark admission. You'll also be able to experience lemurs, sloths, an African tortoise, Aoudad goats, emus and many other animals.

A family playground is accessible to all children and adults and the equipment was specially designed for children of all abilities. The playground area features Inclusive Whirl (including wheelchair access), Mantis Cable Way, Mega Tower with slides, Rainbow Maze, Percussion Play, Custom Racetrack and a Climbing Hill with a Whale. A state-of-the art carousel, made in Italy, has also been added to the Ark, as well as a virtual reality experience.



Exciting Updates on Expansion Projects!

Upcoming projects include a Model of Jerusalem, which will likely be the biggest such exhibit in the world and a larger bus drop off area and a new welcome center. Recently completed projects include: Green River Fossil, Torah Scroll, Tactile Exhibits (adding to existing exhibits – Braille for blind and sensory impaired) and Junior's Zoo Adventure.

At the December meeting of the Grant County Chamber of Commerce, Ken Ham, founder of AiG, announced AiG would be opening a virtual reality ride and planetarium in Pigeon Forge in 2024. This attraction would promote visits to the Ark and Creation Museum. The Ark Encounter hosts speakers, concerts, hands-on-activities and conferences. Plans are to continue 40 Days & Nights Gospel Music Fest held in August/September, as well as Deaf Days, Women's Conference, VBS and high school programs.

Christmas is a special time at the Ark, as thousands of lights twinkle through the December holiday season during ChristmasTime at the Ark. There are festive lights and live music/shows during this free event. Parking and Ark admission is not included.

Future projects at the Ark include Noah's Timber Village featuring family rides and the Tower of Babel. If you are hungry during your Ark Encounter experiences, there are plenty of options including Emzara's Kitchen, a 1500-seat buffet believed to be the largest sit down restaurant in North America. There are also food kiosks located throughout the grounds. In addition to the Ark Encounter, AiG also operates the Creation Museum, 45 miles north of the Ark in Petersburg, Ky.

From unique dining experiences to speakers, concerts and hands-on-activities the Ark Encounter is packed with experiences to make your visit fun, educational and memorable. Some activities cost extra but most are free with paid admission. For admission, hours and ticket info, visit arkencounter.com.

Patriots Landing, located on Eibeck Lane in Williamstown, KY is all about honoring those who have served their country. The process of moving towards the creation of Patriots Landing started 11 years ago with the launch of Operation Honor (OH). OH is a 501c3 charity established to make 'Products with a Purpose,' which are all Veteran-made products including their signature Veteran-Crafted Burial Flag Cases which currently are the only ones carried at Arlington National Cemetery. Patriots Landing is a rural, faith-based veterans workshop in Grant County, KY located on 2.5 acres next to the Kentucky Veterans Cemetery North, less than three miles from the Ark Encounter. It features the Julian Carter Wills Carpentry Veterans Workshop.

Patriots Landing is a Veteran Services Workshop in Grant County, with a Veterans Carpentry Shop and Training Center. Honoring all those who have served where programs focus on healing for both the veteran and their families. It provides on-the-job skills training for veterans who need it the most—each according to his or her specific skills. Patriots Landing centers on sharing the veteran's stories and the healing power of faith to help inspire others in need.



The healing center at Patriots Landing is a place to share stories, a place to listen, a place to be yourself and help others heal. Patriots Landing is a combination of a showroom and meeting area that houses a wide selection of our veteran-crafted Products with a Purpose along with a nice display of military memorabilia for visitors to enjoy.

The Showroom at Patriots Landing is like no other! When you arrive, you will immediately feel a sense of patriotism and will be immersed in a room full of Products With a Purpose. Visitors will without a doubt feel the pride and honor that goes into crafting each piece. Each item will be as unique as the veteran who made it, and as perfectly imperfect as the veterans that receive healing. Every purchase will allow one more product to be made, and one more veteran to be helped as 100% of the proceeds go directly back into programs at Patriots Landing. During your visit, you can spend some time enjoying the military memorabilia displays and be able to view the wood shop and the veterans who are working in the shop.

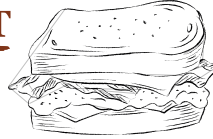

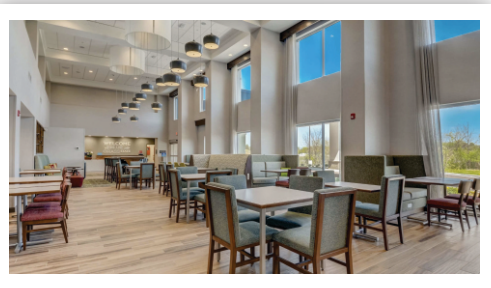
